Dr. Michael R. Freeman Innovation Award Competition

Award Description:	In collaboration with the Heart and Stroke/Richard Lewar Centre of Excellence in Cardiovascular Research (HSRLCE), the academic/teaching hospitals from the Toronto Central Local Health Integration Network (i.e. Hospital for Sick Children, St. Michael's Hospital, Sinai Health Systems, Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre, the Women's College Hospital, the University Health Network and University of Toronto's Translational Biology and Engineering Program) are hosting a Cardiac and Vascular Collaborative Innovation Competition.
	The goal is to spur innovation and collaboration between institutes with the aim of improving quality of care within cardiac and vascular programs.
Award Purpose:	To provide seed funding for novel ideas aimed at cardiovascular disease management, emphasizing collaborative research and development at multiple sites across the Toronto Academic health community and initiated by at least one investigator from a sponsoring site. Priority will be given to ideas with a pathway toward commercialization within 5 years.
Funding Source:	Each of the seven participating sites (HSC, SMH, SBHS, SBHSC, UHN, UofT TBEP and WCH) will commit funds of \$35,000 per site toward associated activities at their site. This will be matched (1:3 ratio) by a \$75,000 support by HSRLCE, to provide a potential total award pool of \$300K per year.
Funding Details:	 The total potential funding available per year is \$300,000 based on multi-site participation in which the HSRLCE will match funds from participating sites with a ratio of 1:3 (HSRLCE: participating site funds). The maximum award per successful proposal is \$150,000. Award term will be one year (awardees have up to 2 years to spend the money). A second term of funding is possible with re-application and associated competitive review.
Timelines:	May 15, 2019: Deadline for Applications August 15, 2019: Notification of Award September 1, 2019: Award Start Date
Eligibility:	 Principal applicants must be full-time staff of HSC, SMH, SHS, SBHSC, UHN, WCH, or UofT campus-based researchers. Projects must be collaborative and must include co-applicants from at least two of the participating institutions (HSC, SMH, SHS, SBHSC, UHN, UofT and WCH). Preference may be given to multidisciplinary projects that span more institutions and should demonstrate added value leveraging local strengths. Principal applicant can only submit one application per year for proposal review.

	 Preference will be given to applications that represent a new unfunded initiative for the applicants.
Eligible Expenses:	 All supplies and services relating to the innovation project are considered eligible. Funds for trainee support (i.e. postdoctoral and graduate) are considered eligible. Purchases of equipment up to \$10,000 are eligible if clearly justified in the budget. Funds for conferences, travel or investigator salaries are NOT considered eligible.
Review Criteria:	Applications will be reviewed on the following criteria: Novelty of innovation, Commercialization potential, Cardiovascular disease target, Multi-site collaboration (HSC, SMH, SHS, SBHSC, UHN, UofT and WCH).
Award Terms:	 Applicants are required to inform the Heart & Stroke/ Richard Lewar Centre of Excellence (HSRLCE) of any related support currently held or applied for from other funding sources and to what extent such support overlaps with the submitted application. Funds will not be released to successful applicants until all appropriate ethics approvals have been obtained from the applicant's Research Ethics Board and forwarded to the HSRLCE.
	 Support from "Heart & Stroke/ Richard Lewar Centre of Excellence in Cardiovascular Research (HSRLCE) and the Toronto Academic Cardiac & Vascular Collaborative (TACVC)" must be acknowledged in all publications, presentations and communications that arise from this funding.
Reporting Requirements:	 Successful applicants are required to provide a financial statement from the institution's finance department itemizing all expenses and showing the balance at the end of each funding year.
	 Successful applicants are required to provide a detailed written report within three (3) months of the end of the funding period. The report must include: A description of the project and results to date (2 pages); A list of publications resulting from research related to the project (1-2 pages); A copy of all manuscripts published and submitted attached to the written report (1-2 pages); and Details on new grants/funding for this project, either received or applied for (1-2 pages).
